



Overview James Winkler is a registered architect and a principal of Converse Winkler Architecture. For the past twenty years of his career, he has devoted himself to the pursuit of design excellence in large scale public projects and urban design. He has worked for noted architects including Charles Moore, Barton Myers, Robert Venturi, and Cesar Pelli on such commissions as the White River Park Masterplan in Indianapolis, the Wang Office Tower in Los Angeles, the Seattle Art Museum, and the Vassar Art Museum. Prior to forming Converse Winkler Architecture, Mr. Winkler was a senior associate at DPK&A Architects in Philadelphia where he was the design team leader for the Philadelphia International Airport Terminal B/C Project, the Erie Federal Courthouse, and the 24th/25th District Police Station in Philadelphia.

Projects by Mr. Winkler have been noted for their sensitivity to context, for their ability to resolve complex functional requirements, and for their design quality. His projects have been recipient of numerous design awards including the Terminal B/C Project which was the recipient of the 1999 Philadelphia Business Journal Design Award.
